PLENARY SESSION I – OPENING BUSINESS SESSION

Thursday, January 25, 2024

The session opened with Praycation by Dr. Djuana Duncombe-Paden, Worship Director.

The Opening Plenary Session of the 2024 Executive Board Meeting was called to order at 9:08 AM by President Dr. Deborah Taylor King. Our Opening Song of Empowerment "Lift Every Voice and Sing" was played via video (WMS Style). President King called for the Tanner-Turner Commission Chair, Mrs. Anita Brannon, to present the Service of Remembrance.

SERVICE OF REMEMBRANCE

The Memorial Service proceeded as follows: Call to Remembrance, solo, "*Great Is Thy Faithfulness*", by Mrs. Brenda Hurst; prayer by Mrs. Shirley Tuggle; and the scripture, *Lamentation 3:22-24*, by Mrs. Shavon Clark Harris. The Service of Remembrance continued with a Necrology Video remembering the lives of Life Members from the Districts who transitioned since the 2023 Quadrennial. The closing song was "*Let the Church Say Amen*."

ROLL CALL

The roll was taken by the Secretarial Team, Recording Secretary Therese' Ann Baker, Assistant Recording Secretary Yvette Smart-Paul and Corresponding Secretary Sherry Peyton, prior to the opening of the Plenary Session as Board Members took their assigned seats. Before the beginning of the session, Secretary Baker called only the names of EBM members. Sixty-eight (68) of one hundred (100) Executive Board members were present (68%), which constituted a quorum. Attachment A (*Page 10*) is a copy of the roll as the first order of business.

PRESENTATION AND APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

The chair recognized First Vice President Charolett Biggs Martin to present the agenda. First Vice-President Martin informed the Executive Board that the agenda was distributed via QR code, to allow viewing by electronic devices. President King asked if there were any changes or objections to the agenda. There were no objections, thus the agenda was approved as presented.

MINUTES

President King recognized Minute Approval Committee Chairperson Sherry Peyton, to inform the assembly of the status of the minutes. Sherry Peyton reported that the 2022 Executive Board Minutes and the 2023 Quadrennial Convention Minutes were reviewed and approved by the Minutes Approval Committee and posted on the Connectional WMS-AMEC Website.

WORDS OF WELCOME AND GREETINGS

Host Bishop Michael Leon Mitchell and Supervisor Cordelia D. Mitchell, 12th Episcopal District Leadership, greeted and welcomed the 2024 Executive Board Meeting and expressed the 12th District's excitement and unity in being the host for this meeting.

Greetings were given by Bishop Adam J. Richardson, Senior Bishop and Dr. John F. Green, Global Witness and Ministry Executive Director.

AFFILIATES' GREETINGS AND RECOGNITION

Ms. Sharon Smith Banks, Affiliates and Ecumenical Relations Chair, recognized and presented Ms. Mira J. Washington, National President, Church Women United who greeted and thanked the WMS for our continual commitment to women and girls fighting for our rights and place, especially in the workplace. She thanked the WMS for fighting for world peace, healthcare, social justice, hunger, and being a voice for the voiceless.

SELECTED OFFICERS' REPORTS

All reports were given via video presentation.

The Vice Presidents' Reports

1st Vice President, Charolett Biggs Martin, highlighted her resolve to engage women in addressing current critical issues through building, birthing, bridging, and branding through interactive videos of real life issues including: the education Race in America; a woman's right over her own body; conducting podcasts on voting issues and human rights; and global input of putting action in a vibe to address Alzheimer's disease; changes in COVID; and accomplishments that occurred under the Commission on Christian Social Action.

2nd Vice President, Lenette Williams King, highlighted activities and accomplishments that occurred under the Commission on Mission Education and Interpretation, including chairing the development of a pictorial reflection history book covering over 150 years as a Women's Missionary Society, along with Historiographer-Statistician Dr. Monica Dillihunt.

3rd Vice President, Sanjena Clay, highlighted activities and accomplishments that occurred under the Commission on Membership and Recruitment, along with the Episcopal Districts' 3rd Vice Presidents and members of the Commission on Membership and Recruitment. The focus for the 2023-2027 Quadrennial is "Get in the Game."

- **Building** Reevaluate and develop programs and services focused on recruiting new members, reclaiming inactive members and retaining current members.
- **Birthing** The office of the 3rd Vice President will collaborate with the Chairpersons of Membership and Recruitment and the Member at Large to develop new and renewed ways to innovatively engage Members, Life Members, Young Adult Missionaries (YAMs) and Associate Members.
- **Bridging** Create innovative programs to reach members worldwide with a focus on including members in Districts 14 20 and YAMs.

• **Branding** – Support the mission goals and the organization by aligning programs emphasizing areas of retention and recruitment to promote the sale of the "official" WMS Membership Cards with "member only" benefits.

The Member at Large Report

Ms. Janita Ferguson, Connectional Member-At-Large, highlighted activities, and accomplishments, including:

- October Pink Power Awareness Month encouraged young adults and adult members to act against
 breast cancer by connecting with over 1000 missionaries throughout the month for events, including:
 Pink Table Talk featuring former Member-At-Large and Breast Cancer survivor, Erica Alston, and Pink
 Sunday showcasing Members and YAMs across the connection rocking the color of PINK to close the
 month.
- December Winter Wonder Yam sponsored and hosted virtual activities led by the Episcopal District Member-At-Large with each day blessed with different activities, including Christmas Jeopardy, Cookie Decoration Contest, Scavenger Hunt, Caroling, Storytime and Comedy Night. YAM's first Mission Project 'Gifts of Warmth' collected and distributed over 2,400 scarves, hats, gloves, and other warm items. Over 100 gift bags filled with African American Products were distributed to students at Shorter College.
- Young Adult Member Theme: Sisters Leading And Yearning to SERVE and IMPACT others (SLAY) will have a core focus on Health and Wellness, Voter Turnout and Educational Enrichment.

The YPD Report

Mrs. Richelle Fry Skinner, Connectional YPD Director accompanied by YPD President Joyce Johnson, highlighted activities and accomplishments for the first six months. The new YPD Quadrennial Theme was announced: **Transformation: Transcending in 3G - Go, Glow and Grow for Christ.** The 2023 Self-Denial Theme was "*Clean Hands*". The 2024 Theme is "Breaking Free". The Self Denial Winners for 2023 were announced. See Attachment B (*Page 13*) for a listing of the Winners.

The Promotion and Missionary Education

Mrs. Alisha Marriott, Connectional PME Director, highlighted activities, and accomplishments, including:

- A PME District Director in every District and 100% representation at the PME Dialogue event.
- Growth achieved with over 18,000 yearbooks and resources being sold.
- Request for 170 PME Books for Districts 14-20.
- Through the support from the local church Allen Temple AME Church, Mount Vernon, New York and Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha, White Queens, New York, \$1,000 was contributed towards that book goal.

The History Book Update

Dr. Monica Dillihunt, Connectional Historiographer/Statistician, gave a synopsis of her report on the status of the History Book. The WMS History Book (with over 3,000 pages) will be available at the General Conference. Over 1,000,000 pictures were collected at the Quadrennial. A QR code will be on display throughout the meeting for continued capturing of pictures.

The Foundation Report

Mrs. Judith Bluitt Redd of the 10th Episcopal District presented the report for The Foundation Board. \$77,000 was raised from the Foundation Walk at the 20th Quadrennial Convention.

The Treasurer's Report

Treasurer Ms. Chandelle R. Ivy gave the financial report and budget for the 2023-2027 Quadrennial Year. The WMS Endowment Fund is managed by the Britton Group of Merril Lynch. The Women's Missionary Society demonstrated sound fiscal management and accountability measures shown in the audit completed March 31, 2023, by the independent accountant firm of Abrams Foster Nole & Williams, P.A.

The budget for the Women's Missionary Society was presented for the Quadrennial years April 1, 2023 to March 31, 2027 for acceptance by the Executive Board. The entire financial statement for The Women's Missionary Society as well as highlights are in the full report included in the 2024 EBM Virtual Booklet. Treasurer Chandelle Ivy moved the adoption of the budget on behalf of the Commission of Administration for this Executive Board. President King asked the members of the Commission on Administration to stand with her, and it was moved that the Executive Board adopt the budget. Following a second, the motion passed. The Budget was adopted by the Commission on Administration for the 2024 year.

PANEL DISCUSSION: HEALTHY CONNECTIONS: A CULTURAL RESPONSE ON BLACK WOMEN'S HEALTH AND WELLNESS

Dr. Linda Frazier, WMS Health and Wellness Chair, was the Moderator. Panelists:

Dr. Zelda West Jones, Family Practice

Dr. William Greenfield, Arkansas

Mrs. Kenya Eddings, 12th District Health Commission

Background information the 3 panelists was presented in the EBM 2024 Agenda and Virtual Booklet

- Discussions began outlining how some of the issues laid the groundwork for Black Women's Health followed by related topics shared by the panel:
- In the 1840's in Alabama, there was a Physician James Marion Simms who performed painful experiments on enslaved Black women and teenagers without anesthesia. These procedures were done on these women without consent. It is now time for Black Women to reclaim their bodies and what is done with their bodies. We must advocate and speak up for ourselves. If we feel uncomfortable when going to the doctor, we can take someone with us and write questions down. That's one way of advocating for ourselves, and it's important for us to do that to reclaim our bodies.
- Dealing with "Implicit Bias" and how it impacts Black Women's Health. Making a judgment before knowing someone's actual health status causes issues with getting proper referrals. We have the right to advocate for ourselves and choose a different doctor or provider if we experience implicit bias.
- Public Health and Social Determinants of Health. This includes residential segregation, which can sometimes impact the type of care received by women. Where we live, where we work, and what we eat are some of the things that we must change in America. We must vote to be able to change the legislation for women so that we can have the necessities of life to decrease the mortality rate.
- Heart Disease is the #1 cause of death for all Americans, #1 cause of death for Black people more than COVID. Heart Disease has claimed more lives than COVID. When we think about heart disease, we think of blood pressure, cholesterol, blood sugar and weight. It is important for us to know our numbers to make changes and be the best version of ourselves. We must know where we are starting from to know where we are going.

• Weathering is when the body has gone through so much that it starts to break down. Stress, racism, and economics start wearing the body down and over time, this starts affecting blood pressure, weight is gained, and chest pain begins, but you keep going and fail to stop, rest, and take time out for self-care.

Confirmation of Appointments for Offices

It was voted and approved for Ethel Willis from the 6th Episcopal District to serve as a Trustee for the Foundation Board and officially elect Yvette Smart-Paul from the 16th Episcopal District to serve as Connectional Assistant Recording Secretary for the Women's Missionary Society.

HANDY SIMMONS SCHOLARSHIP

The Handy Simmons Scholarship Chair, Sister Deana Young McAllister, made the following report, presenting the Handy Simmons Scholarships. AME SADA UPDATES

AME-SADA Executive Director, Robert Nicolas thanked the Women's Missionary Society for their prayers, support and financial resources. Monies received helped women with maternal health and childbirth. Mobile Units with teams of doctors, nurses and technicians established camps in a school, church, or tents for four (4) or five (5) days to provide various services. The Mobile Units served over 200,000 women, which helped in providing adequate nutrition and vaccinations to save lives for both moms and babies.

CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS HIGHLIGHTS

The Constitution and Bylaws Chair, Mrs. Harriet Brown Birk, Esq., highlighted items from her report via a presentation. There was representation from 19 out of 20 Districts on the Constitution and Bylaws Committee, and a process was followed to report on the progress of the organization, to elect officers, and to review our laws.

The Revision and Compilation Sub- Committee reviewed the 76 Proposed Amendments which were submitted within the timeline. The Committee consisted of three former Connectional WMS presidents.

- 54 Amendments were brought forward for voting.
- 22 Amendments were not brought forward (Please note that any of those 22 amendments not brought forward could have been brought to the floor at the Quadrennial Convention. There was no prohibition.)

At the Quadrennial Convention on 8/1/2023, for the first time, the proposed amendments were read one (1) time because the booklet was available and there was a capable representative from each district. 52 Amendments Passed and 2 Failed.

Constitution

• The proposed amendment to our Constitution was that Connectional WMS and YPD shall meet quadrennially, the year preceding the General Conference of the AME Church, at such place and time to be recommended by the WMS President and approved by the Executive Board not to exceed seven (7) days for both conventions. The amendment passed.

WMS Bylaws

- On the Connectional Level 9 Proposed Amendments were presented. 8 Passed and 1 Failed (**Replacing Life Members**).
- On the Episcopal District Level 3 Proposed Amendments were presented: 2 Passed and 1 Failed. (Election of the President and YPD Director)
- On the Conference Level 2 Proposed Amendments were presented and passed.
- On the Local Level 1 Proposed Amendment was presented and passed

YPD Bylaws

- Presented 38 Proposed Amendment and all 38 Passed.
- Connectional Level 19 Proposed Amendments
- Episcopal Level 1 Proposed Amendment
- Conference Level 18 Proposed Amendments
- The amendments ensure that all levels of the YPD are aligned by officers, committees, and duties. YPD
 clarified conflicting language at every level and officially changed the YPD Newsletter to the YPD
 Gazette.

The most impactful changes at the 20th Quadrennial Convention were the time limit for the Quadrennial Convention for both the WMS and YPD; conference approval of Life Member intent; clarification of voting membership at the WMS Conference level; the alignment of YPD officers and committee duties at every level; and elevating the review and voting process to ensure compliance with our documents.

SPECIAL ANNOUNCEMENT (YPD)

The chair recognized Connectional YPD Director Richelle Fry Skinner, joined by Supervisor Alexia Fugh and the YPD Executive Board. They announced an invitation from the 5th Episcopal District to host the 2024 Connectional Learning and Training Institute (LTI) and Executive Board Meeting in Denver, Colorado, March 22-24, 2024. The LTI Mission is: Operation Expansion: Agents for Christ.

SPECIAL ANNOUNCEMENTS - POLITICAL ACTION

The chair recognized WMS Political Action Chair Lisa Johnson Whigham, who gave highlights of the Political Action Forum: The State of Black America: "What's at Stake...Our Votes Matter!" held on Wednesday 1/24/2024. The Moderator was Former Senator Joyce Elliot, Arkansas State Senate, and the Panel included:
